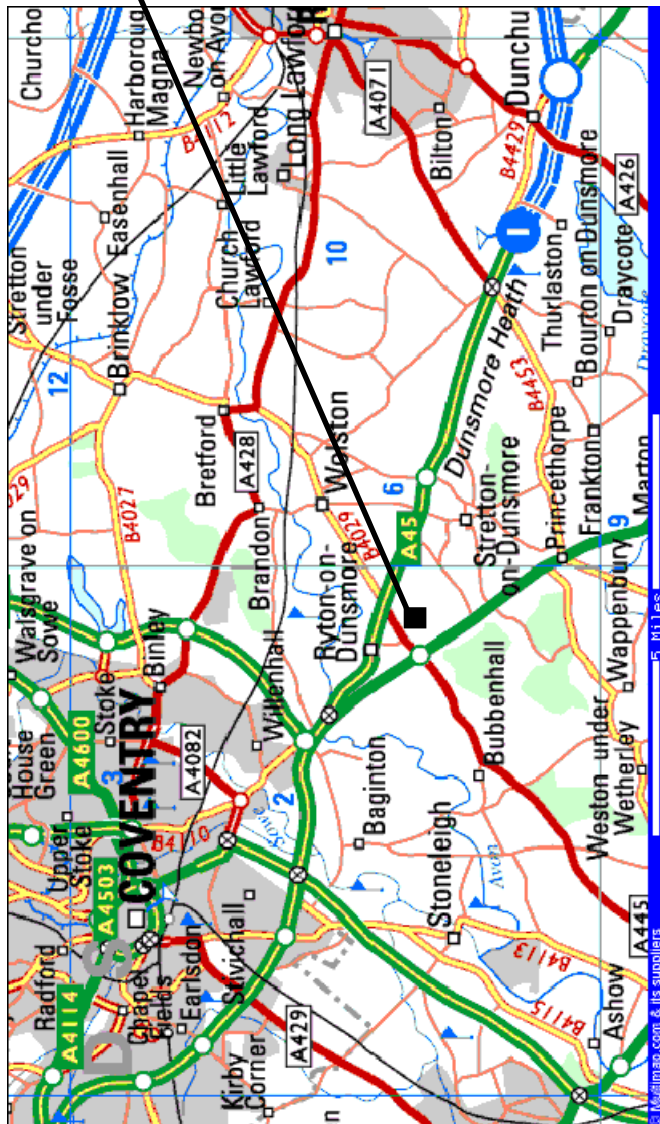

d If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six months and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

MAIDEN: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate, or First Prize at an Open or Championship Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy & Special Puppy excepted) restricted or not.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted whether restricted or not).

UNDERGRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not.

MID LIMIT: For dogs which have not won three Challenge Certificates under or five or more First Prizes in all, at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not won three Challenge Certificate under three different judges or seven or more First Prizes in all, at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

SPECIAL MEMORIAL IN MEMORY OF MISS B CLAY confined to members only

SPECIAL JUNIOR For dogs of seven years of age and not exceeding 10 years of age on the first day of the show.

VETERAN

SPECIAL SENIOR For dogs of ten years of age and over on the first day of the show.

VETERAN

BRACE CLASS for two exhibits (either sex or mixed) belonging to the same Exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace.

caused, that may occur to any exhibitor or his/her servant, or to any other person whatsoever or to any animal, article or property brought to the show or while entering or leaving or being carried into or out of the Show ground. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss or injury that may be done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought to the Show ground by him, and he shall indemnify and hold harmless the Committee from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of such damage or injury.

- 20 The Committee of the Show can accept no responsibility for the products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulation for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 21 No animal other than an exhibit shall be brought into the precincts of the Show during its continuance except a registered Guide Dog for the Blind or Hearing Dog for the Deaf or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
- 22 Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licenced Show, within the licensed Venue and within the environs of that event, including car and caravan parks and approaches. Any organisation holding a Kennel Club Licenced event is required to provide an adequate number of receptacles for the disposal of such fouling.
- 23 CUPS/TROPHIES:- Are to be held until the next BDC Show for which they are required and are limited to fully paid-up Home Members that have been placed 3rd or higher in their respective class. The holder for the time being of any BDC Cup or Trophy shall give approved security to the Cup Steward as to its safe keeping and shall deliver the same in good condition before the next show for which it is awarded. Any engraving shall be carried out at the expense of the winner, but must be in a uniform manner with previous engravings.
- 24 Exhibitors and spectators who have children with them at the Show will be held personally responsible for any damage caused by them whilst at the Show ground.
- 25 For cheques that are returned "Refer to Drawer", the Society will on each occasion levy a charge to cover bank and administrative costs.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which count towards the title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 30th March 2007. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may chose one of the following options:-

- 1 WITHDRAWAL: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of regulation 9(j) and 20.
- 2 TRANSFER:
 - a If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex weight or height and, in the event of their being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or the Junior class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no Puppy or Junior class, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

INTRODUCING YOUR JUDGES

Paul Atkinson (Beaumont)

Paul's first association with the breed was as a child at his local riding school which had 2 Dalmatians and of course the Dalmatians followed the horses, and Paul has been smitten with Dalmatians ever since!

Having owned the most endearing rescue-bitch until her death, he encouraged his first wife to begin showing Dalmatians about 30 years ago, with a bitch puppy from the famous Olbero line, CH Olbero Onsdag Moln of Theakston. Her son, CH Theakston Tamerlan was sired by Paul's CH Beaumont Night Owl of Olbero JW (bred by Mrs Beasley).

He considers it a great honour to be invited to judge again at the BDC Open Show and he very much looks forward to the occasion.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 The show will open at 9.30 am..
- 2 Dogs will be received at any time but it is the Exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3 Judging will commence at 10.00 am - Dogs 10.00 am - Bitches
- 4 Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5 The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- 6 Entry Fees: First entry, £5.50. Each subsequent entry with the same dog, £1.00. Brace £1.00. per brace, Not for Competition, free. Catalogues: £1.50 with entry, £2.00 on the day (limited quantity).
- 7 Prize Money: 1st - £1.50, 2nd - £1.00, 3rd - 50p
- 8 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 9 Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 11 Best Puppy in Show - Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than Breed classes, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
Proviso - For the purpose of this Regulation dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- 12 Best in Show - The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
Withdrawal from other competition Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other other competition other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition
Proviso - For the purpose of this Regulation dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- 13 Exhibits will not be admitted to the Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14 No modification will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 15 All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 16 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 17 Should a judge be prevented from fulfilling their appointment, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another judge to fulfil the duty. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition.
- 18 EXHIBITORS PASSES WILL NOT BE SENT. If acknowledgement of entry is required please forward a stamped addressed card with your entry. All exhibitors will receive free entrance to the Show.
- 19 The Committee, its Officers or Servants will not be responsible for any accident, damage or loss, however

All dogs must be registered at the Kennel Club in the name of the Exhibitor. If the registration or transfer of ownership has not been confirmed it must be applied for before the closing date of entries. If a dog is in the process of registration or transfer at the time the entry is made, add the letters NAF or TAF as appropriate after its name. In case of dispute proof of postage of such applications may be required by the Kennel Club. A puppy under 6 calendar months of age cannot be exhibited. Please put **CLASSES IN NUMERICAL ORDER AND USE block capitals THROUGHOUT** when **COMPLETING THIS ENTRY FORM**. The Kennel Club Authority to Compete number (for dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be stated or the entry will be returned.

I/We further declare that I believe to the best of my knowledge that the dogs are not liable to disqualification under Kennel Club Show Regulations..

NOTE: Dogs entered in breach of Kennel Club Show Regulations are liable to disqualification whether or not the owner was aware of the breach.'

**REGULATIONS FOR
THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)**

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed Event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - a) A dog found at a Show to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
2.
 - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - (c) The shortening of tails of customarily docked breeds but only up to an acceptable age limit which shall be prescribed from time to time.
 - (d) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the K.C. in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
